FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2020 LEGISLATIVE SESSION**Analysis**

Passage of this legislation would have no immediate fiscal impact on the division but would require repealing or amending 6 AAC 25.650. Regulations would need to be in effect soon after the effective date of the legislation.

The division anticipates the number of vote by mail voters would gradually increase over time. It is possible the number of by mail voters could grow to a point where the division would not be able to comply with this statute within the current budget. The division would then need to procure the services of an outside vendor to process and mail ballots. It would not be known until that time what the additional fiscal impact would be to the division.
