FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2020 LEGISLATIVE SESSION**Analysis**

This legislation amends AS 12.47 and provides a process for the appointment of qualified medical professionals in cases where a defendant who has filed notice of intention to rely on affirmative defense of insanity, if there is a reason to doubt the defendant's fitness to stand trial, or if there is reason to believe that a mental disease or defect of the defendant will otherwise become an issue in the case.

There are no anticipated impacts to the current Department of Corrections operational practices if this legislation were passed, therefore, the department is submitting a zero fiscal note.
