FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2019 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

There were 31,267 valid Class A, B and C commercial driver's licenses (CDL) in the State of Alaska as of 1/1/2018. Only 33 of those commercial driver licenses were issued to applicants under the age of 21. Because there are no implementation costs to this change and the demand on resources will be minimal, the Division of Motor Vehicles submits a zero fiscal note.
