FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2020 LEGISLATIVE SESSION**Analysis**

This bill adds patron of a victim of sex trafficking and prostitution to the list of punishable provisions. It adds a new section for sex trafficking in the first, second and third degree; it also adds patron of a victim of sex trafficking as it relates to a person under 18 years of age. It further defines the crimes of human trafficking to include promoting, recruiting, enticement, deception, or inducement; causing another person to engage in adult entertainment or labor, tampering with identification documentation of another.

The Office of Public Advocacy cannot predict the number of new cases that may be charged as a result of this legislation and whether those charged would be appointed a public advocate. Therefore, the Office of Public Advocacy submits an indeterminate fiscal note subject to review of estimates from the Department of Law on potential caseload increases.
