Pursuant to adjournment the House was called to order by Speaker Edgmon at 11:25 a.m.

Roll call showed 23 members present. Representative Rauscher had been excused from a call of the House today. Representatives Carpenter, Eastman, Jackson, Johnson, LeDoux, Merrick, Neuman, Pruitt, Rasmussen, Revak, Shaw, Sullivan-Leonard, Talerico, Tilton, and Vance were absent. Representative Tarr was absent and her presence was noted later.

The invocation was offered by the Chaplain, Representative Kopp. Representative Drummond moved and asked unanimous consent that the invocation be spread on the journal. There being no objection, it was so ordered.

The Speaker ordered the House at ease to allow members of the Senate to leave the Chamber.
