Pursuant to adjournment the House was called to order by Speaker Edgmon at 1:07 p.m.

Roll call showed 33 members present. Representatives Carpenter, Neuman, Rauscher, Revak, Shaw, and Talerico had been excused from a call of the House today.

Representative Thompson moved and asked unanimous consent that Representative Rasmussen be excused from a call of the House today. There being no objection, it was so ordered.

The invocation was offered by the Chaplain, Representative Josephson. Representative Drummond moved and asked unanimous consent that the invocation be spread on the journal. There being no objection, it was so ordered.

With the deepest respect for all religious faiths, on the floor and listening in, I offer the following selection from the Bible.

Yesterday July 20 we recognized and celebrated the 50th anniversary of Apollo 11. On December 24, 1968, seven months before the successful Apollo 11 mission, the Apollo 8 mission approached the moon and began to orbit the moon. At that time the astronauts, William Anders, James Lovell, and Frank Borman said the following:

In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth. And the earth was without form, and void; and darkness was upon the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters. And God said, Let there be light: and there was light. And God saw the light, that it was good: and God divided the light from the darkness.

And God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And the evening and the morning were the first day. And God said, Let there be a firmament in the midst of the waters, and let it divide the waters from the waters. And God made the firmament, and divided the waters which were under the firmament from the waters which were above the firmament: and it was so. And God called the firmament Heaven.
