# Fifteenth Day

Pursuant to adjournment the House was called to order by Speaker Edgmon at 10:40 a.m.

Roll call showed 36 members present. Representatives Carpenter, Neuman, Rauscher, and Talerico had been excused from a call of the House today.

The invocation was offered by the Chaplain, Representative Sullivan-Leonard. Representative Drummond moved and asked unanimous consent that the invocation be spread on the journal. There being no objection, it was so ordered.

#### RECONSIDERATION

#### SB 2002

Representative Thompson brought up reconsideration of the vote on CSSB 2002(FIN) (page 1291).

The following was before the House in third reading:

# CS FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2002(FIN)

"An Act making appropriations, including capital appropriations, appropriations, reappropriations, supplemental and appropriations; amending appropriations; making appropriations to capitalize funds; making appropriations for the capital expenses of the state's integrated comprehensive mental health program; making appropriations under art. IX, sec. 17(c), Constitution of the State of Alaska, from the constitutional budget reserve fund; and providing for an effective date."

The question to be reconsidered: "Shall CSSB 2002(FIN) pass the House?" The roll was taken with the following result:

"An Act making appropriations, including capital appropriations, supplemental appropriations, reappropriations, and other appropriations; amending appropriations; making appropriations

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to capitalize funds; making appropriations for the capital expenses of the state's integrated comprehensive mental health program; and providing for an effective date."

Representative Thompson moved and asked unanimous consent that the roll call on the passage of the bill be considered the roll call on the effective date clause. There being no objection, it was so ordered.

CSSB 2002(FIN)(brf sup maj fld H) was signed by the Speaker and Chief Clerk.

The Speaker stated that, without objection, the House would recess to a call of the Chair; and so, the House recessed at 11:23 a.m.
