## Joint Session in the House

Pursuant to Uniform Rule 51 and an announcement by the presiding officers of an agreement to meet in Joint Session, Speaker Edgmon called the House to order at 10:46 a.m. and turned the gavel over to President Giessel at 11:11 a.m. The purpose of the Joint Session was to consider the Governor's vetoes to SENATE CS FOR CS FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 2001(FIN) am S "An Act making appropriations for the operating and loan program expenses of state government and for certain programs; capitalizing funds; making supplemental appropriations, reappropriations, and other appropriations; making appropriations for the operating and capital expenses of the state's integrated comprehensive mental health program; and providing for an effective date."

The roll of the Senate was called and showed nineteen members present. Senator Wilson was excused.

The roll of the House was taken and showed thirty-eight members present. Representative Gillis was excused. Representative Carpenter was absent.
