## **Fourteenth Day**

Pursuant to adjournment the Senate was called to order by President Giessel at 11:02 a.m.

The roll showed eighteen members present. Senators Hoffman, Wilson were excused from a call of the Senate.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Reverend Gordon Blue, Holy Trinity Episcopal Church. Senator Coghill moved and asked unanimous consent the prayer be spread. Without objection, it was so ordered.
