7 **\*\* Sec. 2.** AS 18.09 is amended by adding new sections to read:

8 **Article 2A. COVID-19 Immunization Rights; Discrimination.**

9 **Sec. 18.09.300. Discrimination based on vaccination status.** (a) Except as  
10 provided in (b) and (c) of this section, it is unlawful discrimination for

11 (1) a person or a governmental entity to refuse, withhold from, or deny  
12 to an individual any local or state services, goods, facilities, advantages, privileges,  
13 licensing, educational opportunities, health care access, or employment opportunities  
14 based on the individual's vaccination status or whether the individual has an immunity  
15 passport;

16 (2) an employer to refuse employment to an individual, to bar an  
17 individual from employment, or to discriminate against an individual in compensation  
18 or in a term, condition, or privilege of employment based on the individual's  
19 vaccination status or whether the individual has an immunity passport; or

20 (3) a public accommodation to exclude, limit, segregate, refuse to  
21 serve, or otherwise discriminate against an individual based on the individual's  
22 vaccination status or whether the individual has an immunity passport.

23 (b) This section does not apply to a vaccination requirement imposed by a

1 (1) school or day care facility; or

2 (2) health care facility if the health care facility

3 (A) asks an employee to volunteer the employee's vaccination  
4 or immunization status for the purpose of determining whether the health care  
5 facility should implement reasonable accommodations to protect the safety and  
6 health of employees, patients, visitors, and other persons from communicable  
7 diseases; a health care facility may consider an employee to be nonvaccinated  
8 or nonimmune if the employee declines to provide the employee's vaccination  
9 or immunization status to the health care facility for the purpose of  
10 determining whether reasonable accommodations should be implemented; and

11 (B) implements reasonable accommodations for employees,  
12 patients, visitors, and other persons who are not vaccinated or not immune to  
13 protect the safety and health of employees, patients, visitors, and other persons  
14 from communicable diseases.

15 (c) A recommendation by a person, governmental entity, or employer that an  
16 employee receive a vaccine is not unlawful discrimination under this section.

17 (d) A person, governmental entity, or employer may not require an individual  
18 to receive a vaccine the use of which is allowed only under an emergency use  
19 authorization or a vaccine undergoing safety trials.

20 **Sec. 18.09.310. Objection to the administration of COVID-19 vaccine.** An  
21 individual may object to the administration of a COVID-19 vaccine to that person  
22 based on religious, medical, or other grounds. A parent or guardian of a minor child  
23 may object to the administration of a COVID-19 vaccine to the minor child based on  
24 religious, medical, or other grounds. A person may not require an individual to  
25 provide justification or documentation to support the individual's decision to decline a  
26 COVID-19 vaccine or to decline a COVID-19 vaccine for a minor child."
