FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2021 LEGISLATIVE SESSION**Analysis**

This legislation inserts a section from AS 16.05.341, free license for disabled veterans and active members of the Alaska National Guard, and military reserves, to the permanent identification card (PID) statutes. The permanent identification card is a free hunting, fishing, and trapping license for residents over 60 years old with no annual renewal.

Currently resident disabled veterans may obtain a free hunting and fishing license from the department; however, trapping licenses are not included. The free disabled veterans license also must be applied for annually. Adding this section to the permanent PID statute would provide a free trapping license for disabled veterans but would also provide a license without annual renewal.

Between CY2017 and CY2020, the division has issued 827 resident trapping licenses on average. These licenses cost \$25 and generate an average of \$20,600 in Fish and Game Fund revenue. The department does not expect that a large number of these licensees are under the age of 60 and also qualify as a disabled veterans. Therefore, the department expects minimal fiscal impact and submits a zero fiscal note.
