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FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

**STATE OF ALASKA
2022 LEGISLATIVE SESSION****Analysis**

SB 160 will create an Alaska Flood Authority with the intent of increasing the availability of flood insurance in the state. This authority will be a non-profit entity and the membership will consist of all licensed property insurers in the state. The legislation outlines the membership of the authority's board and reporting requirements.

The fiscal impact of this legislation on the Division of Community and Regional Affairs' activities related to the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) program is unclear. Therefore, the fiscal impact to the division cannot be determined at this time.
