## Fourth Day

Pursuant to adjournment the Senate was called to order by President Micciche at 10:36 a.m.

The roll showed sixteen members present. Senators Costello, Hoffman, Olson, Revak were absent.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Pastor Eugene Williams, First Baptist Church of Juneau. Senator Stevens moved and asked unanimous consent the prayer be spread. Without objection, it was so ordered.
