Pursuant to adjournment the Senate was called to order by President Micciche at 10:41 a.m.

The roll showed eleven members present. Senator Begich was excused from a call of the Senate. Senators Bishop, Hoffman, Olson, Reinbold Shower, Stedman, von Imhof, and Wielechowski were absent.

The Honorable Lisa Murkowski was escorted to the rostrum and welcomed by President Micciche.

U.S. Senator Lisa Murkowski delivered her address. This address appears in Senate and House Joint Journal Supplement No. 11.

Following her address, there was a question and answer period. Senator Lisa Murkowski received a standing ovation and was escorted from the chamber by Representative Edgmon and Senator Stevens.

Senator Hughes moved and asked unanimous consent the Joint Session stand in adjournment. Without objection, President Micciche adjourned the Joint Session at 12:48 p.m.
