Pursuant to adjournment the Senate was called to order by President Micciche at 11:04 a.m.

The roll showed sixteen members present. Senators Costello, Olson, Reinbold, von Imhof were absent.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Pastor Greg Weinert, Emmanuel Baptist Church. Senator Hoffman moved and asked unanimous consent the prayer be spread. Without objection, it was so ordered.
