The roll showed sixteen members present. Senator Myers was excused from a call of the Senate. Senators Stedman, Wielechowski, Wilson were absent.

The prayer was offered by the Chaplain, Senator Bishop. Senator Hoffman moved and asked unanimous consent the prayer be spread. Without objection, it was so ordered.

Following his address, there was a question and answer period. Senator Sullivan received a standing ovation and was escorted from the chamber by Representative Merrick and Senator Holland.
