### **Second Reading of Senate Bills**

#### SB 140

SENATE BILL NO. 140 "An Act relating to school athletics, recreation, athletic teams, and sports" was read the second time.

CS FOR SENATE BILL NO. 199(FIN) "An Act relating to use of income of the Alaska permanent fund; relating to the amount of the permanent fund dividend; relating to the duties of the commissioner of revenue; and providing for an effective date" was read the third time.

[THE AMOUNT AVAILABLE FOR APPROPRIATION MAY NOT EXCEED THE BALANCE IN THE EARNINGS RESERVE ACCOUNT DESCRIBED IN AS 37.13.145.] In this subsection, "average market value of the fund" includes the balance of the earnings reserve account established under AS 37.13.145, but does not include that portion of the principal attributed to the settlement of State v. Amerada Hess, et al., 1JU-77-847 Civ. (Superior Court, First Judicial District)."
