Pursuant to adjournment the Senate was called to order by President Micciche at 11:14 a.m.

The roll showed seventeen members present. Senators Bishop, Revak were excused from a call of the Senate. Senator von Imhof was absent.

REPORT TO LEGISLATURE. The Department of Education and Early Development shall conduct a study to determine whether AS 14.18.150 - 14.18.190, enacted by sec. 2 of this Act, will result in

an increase in suicide and self-harm by public school students in the state. Not later than the first day of the First Regular Session of the Thirty-Third Alaska State Legislature, the department shall submit the report required under this section to the senate secretary and the chief clerk of the house of representatives and notify the legislature that the report is available."
