1 Page 1, following line 4:

2 Insert a new bill section to read:

3 **** Section 1.** The uncodified law of the State of Alaska is amended by adding a new section
4 to read:

5 LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS. The legislature finds that

6 (1) regardless of the type of hormonal contraceptive, there is a significant
7 increase in the risk of breast cancer associated with hormonal contraceptive use; the risk of
8 breast cancer increases by

9 (A) 23 percent if the contraceptive last prescribed was an oral
10 preparation containing estrogen and progestogen combined;

11 (B) 26 percent if the contraceptive last prescribed was an oral
12 preparation containing only progestogen;

13 (C) 25 percent if the contraceptive last prescribed was an injected
14 progestogen; and

15 (D) 32 percent if the contraceptive last prescribed was a progestogen-
16 releasing intrauterine device;

17 (2) while the increased risk of breast cancer associated with oral contraceptive
18 use declines after discontinuing use, the risk of breast cancer increases by

19 (A) 33 percent if the contraceptive was last prescribed within the year;

20 (B) 17 percent if the contraceptive was last prescribed between one to
21 four years ago; and

22 (C) 15 percent if the contraceptive was last prescribed five or more
23 years ago;

1 (3) when the findings for progestogen-only contraceptives were combined
2 with the findings of previously published studies, there was an increased risk of breast cancer
3 in current and recent users of four types of progestogen-only preparations; the risk of breast
4 cancer was shown to increase by

5 (A) 29 percent for oral preparations containing progestogen;

6 (B) 18 percent for injected preparations containing progestogen;

7 (C) 28 percent for implanted preparations containing progestogen; and

8 (D) 21 percent for progestogen-releasing intrauterine devices;

9 (4) it is estimated that eight out of every 100,000 women between 16 and 20
10 years of age who have used oral contraceptives for a period of five years will develop breast
11 cancer, and that figure increases to 265 out of every 100,000 women for women between 35
12 and 39 years of age."
