FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

Analysis

House Bill 11 creates a new crime, a Class A misdemeanor, for assaulting someone in the presence of a person under 16. This may lead to additional criminal cases being filed for this conduct, but the court system does not anticipate that the number will be substantial and can absorb any additional work with existing resources.

The court system therefore submits this zero fiscal note.
