Analysis

This bill proposes to enact paid Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA) compensation for State of Alaska Executive Branch employees. There is no fiscal or programmatic impact to Executive Branch agencies as a result of this legislation, with the exception of costs associated with processing FMLA requests at the Division of Personnel, which is reflected in a separate fiscal note.
