FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2023 LEGISLATIVE SESSION**Analysis**

This bill establishes the Naturopathy Advisory Board under the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development and amends or adds to the requirements for licensure, licensure renewals, duties to report, suspension and revocation of licensure, grounds to refuse licensure, services and restrictions a licensed naturopath can provide while practicing, and public health duties.

The bill also requires persons applying for licensure to practice naturopathy, or for licensure renewal applications every six years, to submit fingerprints and fees to the Department of Public Safety under AS 12.62.160 for a state criminal history background check, and AS 12.62.400 for a national criminal history background check.

The Department of Public Safety (DPS) Division of Statewide Services maintains the state's criminal history record repository, and manages the state's criminal history background check program.

The DPS estimates the volume of criminal history background check submissions for licensure and renewals for licensure to practice naturopathy to be less than 100 per year. Therefore, the department anticipates a limited fiscal impact and is submitting a zero fiscal note. However, there are multiple bills under consideration with criminal history background check requirements and the combination of those bills, if passed, may result in fiscal impact for DPS.
