FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2024 LEGISLATIVE SESSION**Analysis**

This legislation clarifies the meaning of "public agency" under AS 44.21.410(a)(4) which will eliminate Flores appointments for the Office of Public Advocacy (OPA). Flores appointments are publicly funded divorce cases and are highly litigious and time consuming. The OPA attorneys that handle Flores appointments are also managing large Child in Need of Aid (CINA) and criminal caseloads. As a result, the agency is having to increasingly contract out these cases to private firms.

This legislation will prevent the further expansion of Flores appointments which will negate the need for the agency to request additional attorney positions or contract dollars to handle these civil custody (divorce) cases.
