FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
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Analysis

This legislation amends AS 33.30.015 (a)(3)(I) granting the Department of Corrections the authority to establish a dedicated corrections inmate tablet program to allow the use of inmate tablets. This change would allow inmates access to computers or electronic tablets and expands the use to include prisoner rehabilitation, compliance with a reentry or case plan, access for legal materials, visitation, health care or other purposes identified through regulation. This would allow the department to have the authority to establish a dedicated corrections inmate tablet program to allow the use of inmate tablets.

As this legislation is only granting the authority to establish an inmate tablet program, there is no immediate financial impact.
