FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

Analysis

This bill primarily impacts the Regulatory Commission of Alaska and establishes a “Clean energy standard” for those load-serving utilities subject to the standards of an electric reliability organization. Under this legislation, the Alaska Energy Authority would be required to submit a biennial report on clean energy activity throughout the state, and to create a report of recommended updates to the definitions of clean energy technology every five years.

The volume of work associated with creating the biennial report and the five-year report on technology terminology is not yet known. The Alaska Energy Authority will plan to complete the reports within existing budgeted authority.
