2023 LEGISLATIVE SESSION**Analysis**

SB 29 establishes the Alaska Civics Education Commission in the Department of Education and Early Development.

Sec. 14.07.220. Meetings. states that the commission shall meet at least every three months and that legislative council may assist the commission in conducting meetings by providing office space, equipment, and additional staff support. The sponsor's intent is that the legislative council would make available existing meeting space in the Capitol, the Anchorage Legislative Office Building, and possibly legislative office space in other locations, as well as teleconference support for quarterly commission meetings using existing staff and equipment resources; therefore, there is no anticipated fiscal impact to the legislature.
