FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2023 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

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Analysis

This bill makes substantive and conforming substantive and conforming amendments to statutes relating to sex offenses, sex offender registration, stalking, sex trafficking as registerable offenses, and domestic violence.

The Department of Public Safety (DPS) maintains the state's central registry of sex offenders under AS 18.65.087. The changes proposed in this bill will impact the business and technical procedures DPS has in place to manage the registry in order to capture the additional data fields and information on registered sex offenders. However, it is anticipated the changes as proposed in this bill can be implemented with existing resources.
