FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

Analysis

This bill raises the minimum legal age to purchase tobacco and nicotine products from 19 to 21 and requires licensed tobacco retailers to verify age at the time of purchase and at delivery when transporting or shipping tobacco products in Alaska.

This bill affects the Division of Public Health, which is responsible for implementing a comprehensive Tobacco Prevention and Control Program. Since the federal T21 law passed in 2019, the division created a webpage for tobacco retailers with information and resources to assist retailers in complying with the new federal T21 age restrictions. The division already provides information about complying with the federal T21 law.

There is limited programmatic impact and no fiscal impact is foreseen; therefore this is a zero dollar fiscal note.
