FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2023 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

This bill requires the Department of Corrections (DOC) to issue a valid state identification to a prisoner if the prisoner does not have one before their release.

The bill creates a new misdemeanor crime for knowingly making a fraudulent written statement or application for a DOC identification card, for possessing, using, producing, or manufacturing a fraudulent DOC identification card, or for allowing another person to use a DOC identification card issued to another person.

The Division of the Alaska State Troopers enforce state laws, and while this bill does create a new misdemeanor level crime, the department does not anticipate a fiscal impact from this legislation.
