(b) Unless the state fire marshal adopts regulations under (c) of this section requiring use of an alternative firefighting substance, a person may use a firefighting substance that contains a perfluoroalkyl substance or polyfluoroalkyl substance to respond to a fire that originates in relation to oil or gas production, transmission, transportation, or refining in the state.

(c) If the state fire marshal determines an alternative firefighting substance listed by an organization recognized by the federal Occupational Safety and Health Administration's Nationally Recognized Testing Laboratory Program is safe and effective, the state fire marshal shall adopt regulations requiring use of the alternative firefighting substance. The regulations must state the proposed effective date of the regulations.

(d) The department shall ensure the state accepts for disposal from a person domiciled in a community in the state with a population of less than 2,000 that is off the road system, or a person domiciled in the state who received a firefighting substance that contains a perfluoroalkyl substance or polyfluoroalkyl substance from a partially state funded fire safety project, a

firefighting substance that contains a perfluoroalkyl substance or polyfluoroalkyl substance in a quantity not to exceed 40 gallons each year.

* **Sec. 3.** Section 2 of this Act takes effect January 1, 2024."
