Delete "instruction in mental health"

Insert "mental health instruction on the warning signs of suicide, self-harm, addiction, or sociopathy"

Page 2, line 19, following "child":

Insert ": a notification under this paragraph must describe the topics to be addressed, the curriculum, and the list of approved intervention resources, and must provide a form allowing a parent to withdraw the child from the class or program"

Page 2, line 26, following the first occurrence of "health":

Insert "on the warning signs of suicide, self-harm, addiction, and sociopathy,"

Page 3, line 1:

Delete "instruction in mental health"

Insert "mental health instruction on the warning signs of suicide, self-harm, addiction, and sociopathy. Any intervention resource included in the instruction must be approved in advance by the local governing body of the school."

Page 3, line 2:

Delete "instruction in mental health"

Insert "mental health instruction on the warning signs of suicide, self-harm, addiction, and sociopathy"

Page 3, line 22:

Delete "instruction in mental health"

Insert "mental health instruction on the warning signs of suicide, self-harm, addiction, and sociopathy"

Page 3, line 29:

Delete "mental health guidelines"

Insert "guidelines for mental health instruction on the warning signs of suicide, self-harm, addiction, and sociopathy"
