11 **** Sec. 5.** AS 14.17.420(a) is amended to read:

12 (a) As a component of public school funding, a district is eligible for special
13 needs and secondary school vocational and technical instruction funding and may be
14 eligible for intensive services funding as follows:

15 (1) special needs funding is available to a district to assist the district
16 in providing special education, gifted and talented education, vocational education,
17 and bilingual education services to its students; a special needs funding factor of 1.20
18 shall be applied as set out in AS 14.17.410(b)(1);

19 (2) in addition to the special needs funding for which a district is
20 eligible under (1) of this subsection, a district is eligible for intensive services funding
21 for each special education student who needs and receives intensive services and is
22 enrolled on the last day of the count period; for each such student, intensive services
23 funding is equal to the intensive student count multiplied by 13;

1 (3) in addition to the special needs and intensive services funding
 2 available under (1) and (2) of this subsection, secondary school vocational and
 3 technical instruction funding is available to assist districts in providing vocational and
 4 technical instruction to students who are enrolled in a secondary school; a secondary
 5 school vocational and technical instruction funding factor of **1.023** [1.015] shall be
 6 applied as set out in AS 14.17.410(b)(1); in this paragraph, "vocational and technical
 7 instruction" excludes costs associated with

8 (A) administrative expenses; and

9 (B) instruction in general literacy, mathematics, and job
 10 readiness skills.

11 * **Sec. 6.** AS 14.17.420 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

12 (d) If the legislature increases the secondary school vocational and technical
 13 instruction funding factor under (a)(3) of this section, a district shall budget for and
 14 spend on secondary school vocational and technical instruction an amount equal to the
 15 increase in the funds generated for the district by the increase to the secondary school
 16 vocational and technical instruction funding factor under (a)(3) of this section."

 25 grant of not less than \$450 for each student in kindergarten through grade six who, at
 26 the end of the school year,

27 (1) performs at grade-level reading proficiency; or

28 (2) demonstrates improvement on a reading screening tool approved
 29 by the department, on a standards-based assessment in language arts approved by the
 30 department, or on a student portfolio in language arts approved by the department.

31 (b) If insufficient funding is appropriated to provide all grants authorized

1 under this section, the grants shall be distributed pro rata to eligible school districts."

7 **** Sec. 10.** AS 43.20 is amended by adding a new section to article 2 to read:

8 **Sec. 43.20.149. Highly digitized businesses tax revenue.** The tax amounts
9 collected from a highly digitized business under AS 43.20 shall be separately
10 accounted for and may be appropriated to the Department of Education and Early
11 Development. The Department of Education and Early Development shall use funds
12 appropriated under this section to fund reading proficiency incentive grants awarded
13 under AS 14.30.773. If the amount appropriated to the Department of Education and
14 Early Development exceeds the amount necessary to award grants under AS 14.30.773
15 for the fiscal year, the department shall use the remaining balance of the appropriation
16 to fund secondary school vocational and technical instruction. The department shall
17 distribute the secondary school vocational and technical instruction funding to
18 secondary schools on a pro rata basis."

2 * **Sec. 14.** The uncodified law of the State of Alaska is amended by adding a new section to
3 read:

4 CONDITIONAL EFFECT. AS 14.17.420(a), as amended by sec. 5 of this Act,
5 AS 14.17.420(d), enacted by sec. 6 of this Act, AS 14.30.773, enacted by sec. 8 of this Act,
6 and AS 43.20.149, enacted by sec. 10 of this Act, take effect only if SB 113 or a substantially
7 similar bill that effectuates the sales factor, as determined under AS 43.19 (Multistate Tax
8 Compact), as the apportionment factor for highly digitized businesses is passed by the Thirty-
9 Fourth Alaska State Legislature and enacted into law.

10 * **Sec. 15.** If secs. 5, 6, 8, and 10 of this Act take effect, they take effect 181 days after the
11 effective date of the section of SB 113 or a substantially similar bill that effectuates the sales
12 factor, as determined under AS 43.19 (Multistate Tax Compact), as the apportionment factor
13 for highly digitized businesses."
