2 Insert "; and supporting and expressing gratitude to President Donald J. Trump  
3 for the Executive Order titled "Unleashing Alaska's Extraordinary Resource Potential"  
4 and for the president's recognition of the role of the federal government in revitalizing  
5 the state's economy, energy production, and resource development"

7 Page 2, line 24, following "culture;":

9 **WHEREAS** the state holds an abundant and largely untapped supply of natural  
10 resources, including minerals, timber, and seafood, which are critical to the state's economy  
11 and the prosperity of its citizens; and

12 **WHEREAS** the Executive Order titled "Unleashing Alaska's Extraordinary Resource  
13 Potential" provides that, to the benefit of the nation and state residents, the policy of the  
14 United States shall be to fully avail itself of the state's land and resources; and

15 **WHEREAS** that Executive Order demonstrates that the federal government  
16 understands the importance of the state to national energy security and global energy markets  
17 and how advancing responsible resource development in the state will bolster the nation's  
18 economic and strategic interests; and

19 **WHEREAS** the President of the United States has directed the agencies of the federal  
20 government to work to maximize the development and production of natural resources from  
21 federal and state land in the state and to expedite associated permitting and leasing  
22 procedures; and

23 **WHEREAS** the President of the United States has directed that the development of

1 the state's liquefied natural gas potential should be prioritized, as should sale and  
2 transportation of that gas to other regions of the nation and to the nation's allies; and

3 **WHEREAS** the President of the United States has directed the heads of all federal  
4 executive departments and agencies, including the Secretary of the Interior, the Secretary of  
5 Commerce, and the Secretary of the Army, to exercise their authority to advance resource  
6 development projects in the state; and

7 **WHEREAS** the President of the United States has directed federal agencies to  
8 rescind, revoke, revise, amend, defer, or grant exemptions from any regulations, orders,  
9 guidance documents, and policies inconsistent with the development policies set out in the  
10 Executive Order titled "Unleashing Alaska's Extraordinary Resource Potential"; and

11 **WHEREAS**, in the Executive Order titled "Unleashing Alaska's Extraordinary  
12 Resource Potential," the President of the United States has directed the Secretary of the  
13 Interior

14 (1) to withdraw Secretarial Order 3401, dated June 1, 2021, which  
15 suspended oil and gas leases in the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge;

16 (2) to rescind the cancellation of certain mineral leases in the Arctic  
17 National Wildlife Refuge, initiate additional mineral leasing activity, and issue permits  
18 and easements necessary for oil and gas exploration, development, and production in  
19 the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge;

20 (3) to rescind the final supplemental environmental impact statement  
21 titled "Coastal Plain Oil and Gas Leasing Program Supplemental Environmental  
22 Impact Statement";

23 (4) to place a temporary moratorium on all activities and privileges  
24 granted to a party under a 2020 record of decision titled "Coastal Plain Oil and Gas  
25 Leasing Program Record of Decision," to review the decision, and, as appropriate, to  
26 conduct a new analysis;

27 (5) to reinstate a final environmental impact statement titled "Final  
28 Environmental Impact Statement for the Coastal Plain Oil and Gas Leasing Program";

29 (6) to reinstate a 2020 record of decision titled "Coastal Plain Oil and  
30 Gas Leasing Program Record of Decision," referenced in the notice for the 2021  
31 Coastal Plain Alaska Oil and Gas Lease Sale;

1 (7) to evaluate changes to and the potential rescission of Public Land  
2 Order 5150, signed by the Assistant Secretary of the Interior on December 28, 1971,  
3 and any later amendments, modifications, or corrections to Public Land Order 5150;

4 (8) to place a temporary moratorium on all activities and privileges  
5 granted to a party under the record of decision signed on June 27, 2024, titled "Ambler  
6 Road Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement Record of Decision," to review  
7 that decision, and to reinstate the record of decision signed on July 23, 2020, by the  
8 Bureau of Land Management and United States Army Corps of Engineers titled  
9 "Ambler Road Environmental Impact Statement Joint Record of Decision";

10 (9) to rescind a 2024 Bureau of Land Management final rule titled  
11 "Management and Protection of the National Petroleum Reserve in Alaska";

12 (10) to rescind certain guidance issued by the Bureau of Land  
13 Management related to the protection of subsistence resource values in the National  
14 Petroleum Reserve in Alaska;

15 (11) to facilitate the expedited development of a road corridor between  
16 the community of King Cove and the Cold Bay Airport;

17 (12) to place a temporary moratorium on all activities and privileges  
18 granted to a party under the record of decision signed on April 25, 2022, titled  
19 "National Petroleum Reserve in Alaska Integrated Activity Plan Record of Decision"  
20 and to review that decision;

21 (13) to rescind a 2024 Bureau of Land Management final rule titled  
22 "Management and Protection of the National Petroleum Reserve in Alaska" and  
23 rescind a 2024 Bureau of Land Management notice titled "Special Areas Within the  
24 National Petroleum Reserve in Alaska";

25 (14) to reinstate Secretarial Order 3352 dated May 17, 2017 (National  
26 Petroleum Reserve - Alaska) and the record of decision signed on December 31, 2020,  
27 titled "National Petroleum Reserve in Alaska Integrated Activity Plan Record of  
28 Decision";

29 (15) to reinstate Public Land Orders that further the policy interests  
30 described in the Executive Order;

31 (16) to review all guidance from the Department of the Interior

1 regarding the taking of Alaska Native land into trust and all Public Land Orders  
2 withdrawing land for selection by Alaska Native corporations to determine whether an  
3 action of the department should be revoked to ensure consistency with the Alaska  
4 Statehood Act of 1958, the Alaska National Interest Lands Conservation Act, the  
5 Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act of 1971, the Alaska Land Transfer Acceleration  
6 Act, and the Alaska Native Vietnam-era Veterans Land Allotment Program;

7 (17) to rescind the record of decision signed on November 12, 2024,  
8 titled "Central Yukon Record of Decision and Approved Resource Management Plan";

9 (18) to reimplement a draft resource management plan and  
10 environmental impact statement referenced in the National Park Service notice titled  
11 "Notice of Availability for the Central Yukon Draft Resource Management  
12 Plan/Environmental Impact Statement, Alaska";

13 (19) to rescind a 2024 National Park Service final rule titled "Alaska;  
14 Hunting and Trapping in National Preserves" and reinstate a 2020 National Park  
15 Service final rule titled "Alaska; Hunting and Trapping in National Preserves" in its  
16 original form;

17 (20) to deny a request relating to recognition of an Indigenous sacred  
18 site in the coastal plain of the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge; and

19 (21) to review waterways in the state, to direct the Bureau of Land  
20 Management, in consultation with the state, to recommend the navigable waterways in  
21 the state that should be subject to state jurisdiction under the equal footing doctrine  
22 and the Submerged Lands Act of 1953, and to disclaim federal interests in and restore  
23 state ownership of certain waterways in the state; and

24 **WHEREAS** the President of the United States has directed that each bureau in the  
25 Department of the Interior consider the cultural significance of hunting and fishing in the  
26 state, evaluate how subsistence use of certain resources should be prioritized under the  
27 provisions of the Alaska National Interest Lands Conservation Act, consult with state fish and  
28 wildlife management agencies before enacting land management plans or other regulations  
29 that affect the ability of state residents to hunt and fish on public land, and ensure that hunting  
30 and fishing opportunities on federal land are consistent with the opportunities offered on state  
31 land; and

1           **WHEREAS**, to advance the nation's domestic and regional energy dominance, the  
2 President of the United States has directed the Secretary of the Interior to identify and assess,  
3 with the Secretary of Defense, what is necessary to immediately develop and export the state's  
4 energy resources, including an assessment of the long-term viability of the Trans Alaska  
5 Pipeline System and the development of the associated federal right-of-way as an energy  
6 corridor of critical national importance; and

7           **WHEREAS** the President of the United States has directed the Secretary of  
8 Agriculture to place a temporary moratorium on all activities and privileges authorized by a  
9 2023 final rule and record of decision titled "Special Areas; Roadless Area Conservation;  
10 National Forest System Lands in Alaska," to review the rule and record of decision, and, as  
11 appropriate, to conduct a new analysis; and

12           **WHEREAS** the President of the United States has directed the Secretary of  
13 Agriculture to reinstate a 2020 final rule titled "Special Areas; Roadless Area Conservation;  
14 National Forest System Lands in Alaska"; and

15           **WHEREAS** the President of the United States has directed the Secretary of the Army,  
16 acting through the Assistant Secretary of the Army for Civil Works, to render all assistance  
17 requested by the Governor of the state to facilitate the clearing and maintenance of  
18 transportation infrastructure; and

19           **WHEREAS** the President of the United States has directed the Assistant Secretary of  
20 the Army for Civil Works to immediately review, revise, or rescind an agency action that  
21 could delay any critical project in the state;"

25           **FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Alaska State Legislature expresses its gratitude to  
26 President Donald J. Trump for the Executive Order titled "Unleashing Alaska's Extraordinary  
27 Resource Potential," which recognizes the essential role of the state's resources in supporting  
28 national prosperity, energy independence, and economic growth; and be it

29           **FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Alaska State Legislature acknowledges the positive  
30 economic, social, and strategic effects of the Executive Order on the state and supports its full  
31 implementation; and be it

1           **FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Alaska State Legislature urges all relevant federal  
2 agencies to act swiftly and efficiently to carry out the provisions of the Executive Order,  
3 ensuring timely permitting, leasing, and project development in the state; and be it

4           **FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Alaska State Legislature reaffirms the state's  
5 commitment to working collaboratively with federal, state, and local partners to maximize the  
6 benefits of the state's resources for all citizens, while safeguarding environmental and cultural  
7 values"
