FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

Analysis

House Bill 25 introduces a prohibition on the use of polystyrene foam (also known as styrofoam) disposable food service ware by restaurants and state entities, with the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) responsible for overseeing compliance. To implement these requirements, the Environmental Health Division can integrate compliance into existing processes without the need for regulatory development or significant additional staff workload. Therefore, DEC would implement the bill using existing resources.
