FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

Analysis

This legislation changes the ethics disclosure procedures for conflict of interests for Board of Fisheries and Board of Game members by allowing members to deliberate on topics for which personal or financial conflict of interests have been determined to exist. The board member is still not able to vote on the matter.

This legislation does not impact any department function or program and is not anticipated to add a significant amount of time to board meetings, if any. Therefore, the department expects no fiscal impact and submits a zero fiscal note.
