FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2026 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

HB 47 creates two new crimes, *Distribution of generated obscene child sexual abuse material* and *Possession of generated obscene child sexual abuse material*. The legislation also expands the crime of *Possession of child sexual abuse material* to include material that depicts or represents child sexual abuse material with a subject that is indistinguishable from an actual, identifiable child.

The new crimes created by the legislation codify and provide legal clarity prohibiting the use of artificial intelligence generative technology to create artificial images of child sexual abuse material. The Department of Family and Community Services, Division of Juvenile Justice will respond to delinquency referrals for these new crimes based on the individual needs of juveniles and their families, and the victims and communities impacted. No fiscal impact is anticipated.
