FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

Analysis

The House Judiciary Committee Substitute for House Bill 101 raises the age for minors who may be victims of various crimes, such as sexual abuse of a minor, murder, enticement of a minor, distribution of obscene material to a minor, and other crimes, from 16 to 18 years of age. The CS provides that the offender must be at least two years older than the victim to fit the definition of most of these crimes.

This will have the effect of making more conduct fit the definition of those crimes, including making more types of conduct fit the definition of sexual abuse of a minor. It is anticipated that it will lead to more criminal cases being filed by the Department of Law for those crimes against minors. The court system does not have data or information with which to estimate the increase in workload in the courts that this bill would generate.

The court system will monitor the impacts of this bill to determine if it will require fiscal resources in the future, but at this time, the court system submits this zero fiscal note.
