FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2025 LEGISLATIVE SESSION**Analysis**

HB 105 mandates the development of guidelines for mental health instruction in schools, to be created by the Board of Education and Early Development in consultation with the Department of Health (DOH), the Department of Family and Community Services, regional tribal health organizations, and representatives of national and state mental health organizations. It requires local school boards to adopt policies that promote parent involvement in education, including the right to withdraw children from certain activities, classes, and tests related to sensitive topics like mental health. The bill also encourages the implementation of health education programs in schools, covering mental health, personal safety, and other health topics, and outlines the creation of developmentally appropriate mental health instruction guidelines.

The changes will affect school boards, parents, students, and educational organizations, with an emphasis on ensuring parental control over certain educational content and improving mental health education in schools. The impact to the Division of Behavioral Health will be low.

There is no anticipated fiscal impact.
