FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2025 LEGISLATIVE SESSION**Analysis**

This bill authorizes the Department of Administration (DOA) to adopt regulations for electronic identification cards and electronic driver's licenses. It also authorizes the DOA Commissioner to enter into agreements with law enforcement agencies, governmental entities, and data exchange services. However, it does not eliminate the requirement for individuals to retain a physical driver's license or identification card.

The bill also provides that peace officers are immune from liability for unintentional damage to a mobile electronic device presented for verification, unless the damage results from intentional misconduct.

While this bill allows the public to present drivers' licenses electronically, the Department of Public Safety does not anticipate a significant impact on existing procedures for requesting and verifying this information.

Given these provisions, the department submits a zero fiscal note.
