FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2026 LEGISLATIVE SESSION**Analysis**

This bill increases criminal penalties for criminally negligent homicide and criminally negligent homicide of an unborn child when the offense occurs during operation of a motor vehicle and the operator knowingly fails to stop and render aid. The bill reclassifies this conduct as a class A felony, adjusts presumptive sentencing ranges, and requires consecutive sentencing for related failure-to-render-aid offenses.

The Department of Public Safety, through the Alaska State Troopers, already investigates fatal motor vehicle crashes and offenses involving failure to stop and render aid. The bill does not create new enforcement responsibilities, investigative requirements, or programmatic duties for the department.

Any impact of this legislation is limited to charging decisions and sentencing outcomes within the existing criminal justice system. The department does not anticipate an increase in case volume or workload that would require additional personnel, overtime, travel, or operational resources.

The Department of Public Safety does not anticipate a fiscal impact.
