FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2025 LEGISLATIVE SESSION**Analysis**

HCR 3 creates a seven-member legislative task force to examine the development, implementation, and regulation of artificial intelligence in the state.

The task force will be comprised of three senators appointed by the senate president and four representatives appointed by the speaker of the house. One of the representatives will be designated to serve as chair. The task force will produce a report of its findings and recommendations to the legislature by January 31, 2026, and will expire February 2, 2026.

It is the sponsor's intent that the task force will meet during the interim through a combination of virtual and in-person meetings. In-person meetings are expected to be single-day sessions held at the Anchorage Legislative Office Building, supported by existing resources from the Legislative Affairs Agency. It is further anticipated that administrative and other support will be provided by existing legislative staff.

The legislation specifies that members are entitled to per diem and travel for in-person meetings, which is determined by Legislative Council policy. It is anticipated that a majority of task force members may be from Anchorage, therefore a meeting held in Anchorage would be at minimal cost; however, because the legislation allows for an unknown cost, the fiscal impact on the legislature is indeterminate.
