FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2025 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

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Analysis

This legislation will allow physician assistants who have obtained 4,000 hours of postgraduate clinical experience under a collaborating agreement with a physician to operate without physician supervision in the state.

This bill amends AS 21.07.010(b), patient and health care provider protection, requiring a contract between a health care provider and health care insurer may not impose a practice, education, or collaboration requirement on physician assistants that is inconsistent with or more restrictive than the requirements imposed under AS 08.64 or a regulation adopted by the State Medical Board.

The Division of Insurance does not anticipate fiscal impact from this legislation.
