FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2026 LEGISLATIVE SESSION**Analysis**

This legislation would allow physician assistants (PAs) who have obtained 6,000 hours of postgraduate clinical experience under a collaborating agreement with a physician to operate without physician supervision in the state. Additionally, it would allow the State Medical Board to set the scope of practice for PAs in regulation. It would also allow the board to set requirements for a PA to practice under a new specialty, including the additional hours of postgraduate clinical experience required in that specialty, and the methods of periodic assessment that a collaborating physician can use to evaluate a PA.

The Division of Corporations, Business and Professional Licensing does not anticipate fiscal impact from this legislation.

Professional licensing programs within the Division of Corporations, Business and Professional Licensing are funded by Receipt Supported Services, fund source 1156 Rcpt Svcs (DGF). Per AS 08.01.065, licensing fees for each occupation are set so the total amount of revenue collected approximately equals the occupation's actual regulatory costs.
