FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2025 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

SB 90 allows minors 16 years of age and older, who provide documentation they are an unaccompanied homeless minor, or a minor living apart from their parent/legal guardian, and who are managing their own financial affairs, regardless of source or extent of income, to seek and give their own consent for behavioral and mental health services. Under this bill the providers must receive consent from parents/guardians past five appointments unless it would be detrimental to the minor's well-being.

These changes would affect the Department of Family and Community Services, but not increase or decrease any cost incurred by the department.
