FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2025 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

This bill updates Alaska’s motor vehicle and identification systems by introducing statutory changes that enable electronic driver’s licenses and identification cards while retaining physical alternatives. It enhances law enforcement privacy protections for electronic documents. The bill also authorizes data-sharing agreements with national driver databases.

The division believes that the bill's implementation will not result in any financial changes and therefore submits a zero fiscal note.
