Analysis

This bill modernizes public notice procedures by giving state agencies the discretion of posting public notices in a paper of general circulation.

The Department will need to make modifications to public notice requirements in multiple regulatory chapters to align language with this legislation.

There is no fiscal impact associated with the legislation for the Department.
