## FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

## Analysis

Senate Bill 212 amends AS 22.10.120 to increase the number of superior court judges in the state from 45 to 46, and specifies that the one added judge will be assigned to the Third Judicial District. Specifically, the new judge will be assigned to serve in the Palmer courthouse.

Adding a new superior court judge will require a total of four new court employees. First, the cost of the judge will include the salary, benefits (health care, retirement system contributions, SBS), supplies (desk, chair, computer, books, miscellaneous), and contractual services/licenses (Westlaw, Courtview, etc.). The total for the judge would be \$356,000.

In addition, a judge requires a *judicial assistant* (a Range 12 employee) to handle administrative tasks. Superior court judges work closely with their *judicial law clerk* (a Range 13 employee), who does legal research and helps with drafting certain documents. Finally, the judge requires an *in-court clerk* (a Range 12 employee) who handles courtroom management, including recordings, exhibits, calendaring, and in-court documents. The total for these three positions, including annual salary, benefits, supplies, and contractual services/licenses is \$324,000.

In addition, in the initial year, one-time funding would be needed to purchase software licenses, furniture, computers, sound/recording systems, and other electronics for the courtroom and offices. The total for these costs is \$95,500 in year one only.

In sum, adding a new superior court judge in Palmer will have a fiscal impact of \$775,500 in the initial year (total costs for the four positions and one-time expenditures), and ongoing costs for future years of \$680,000. Therefore, these amounts are reflected in this fiscal note from the court system.
