FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS

STATE OF ALASKA
2026 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Analysis

It is anticipated that this bill will not have a direct fiscal impact to the state outside of regulatory changes.

Background

This bill is a response to book bans and acts of censorship experienced by public libraries and school libraries in Alaska. It has three primary purposes: to legally protect employees of schools, libraries, and museums against civil or criminal liability; to institute a statewide library collections management policy; to allow individuals to sue the government if it violates library anti-censorship rules.

The bill proposes to amend AS 11.41.452 *Enticement of a minor*, AS 11.51.130 *Contributing to the delinquency of a minor*, and AS 11.61.128 *Distribution of indecent material to minors* with a new subsection to each that provides a legal safeguard for officials of a school, museum, or library from criminal liability when executing their professional duties.

This bill also proposes to amend AS 14.56 *State and Community Libraries* with the addition of *Article 7. Access to Library Material* and four related sections, 14.56.450 *Public library material policy*, 14.56.455 *School library material policy*, 14.56.460 *Private right of action*, and 14.56.465 *Definitions*. These amendments seek to institute and regulate collection development policies for Alaska public and school libraries using a model library collection development policy established by the Commissioner for the Department of Education and Early Development.

Amendments to AS 11.41.452, AS 11.51.130, and AS 11.61.128 are anticipated to have minimal impact on the public and private sector as primary intent is to protect individual employees of schools, libraries, or museums from accusation of criminal wrongdoing while engaged in the course of their work.

Amendments to AS 14.56 would have a direct impact on the Department of Education and Early Development and Division of Libraries, Archives and Museums who would be tasked with establishing, updating, and implementing a statewide model library collection development policy. The proposed amendments to AS 14.56 would also have far-reaching impact and a significant regulatory burden on over 100 Alaska public and school libraries who currently operate with diverse collection management policies developed and overseen under local control of their governing authorities. Amendment to AS 14.56 creates strong legal protections against government censorship of library materials and provides clear enforcement mechanisms through private lawsuits.
