HOUSE BILL NO. 101

IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA

TWENTY-FIRST SESSION

A BILL

For an Act entitled: "An Act prescribing criminal penalties for drunkenness and for selling or giving intoxicating liquor to ^{habitual} common drunkards."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

Section 1. Every person who shall be drunk in or upon any boat, train, bus or other vehicle commonly used for the transportation of passengers, or in or about any depot, platform, wharf or waiting room, or upon any public street, or at any public gathering, or in any hotel lobby, store, card room, dance hall, theatre, liquor dispensary, or any other public place, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than three hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in jail for not more than ^{60 days} ~~six months~~, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 2. Every person who in any twelve month period shall be four times convicted of a violation of Section 1 of ~~this act~~, shall be deemed a ^{habitual} common drunkard, and shall be so adjudged by any court before whom he may be brought on a charge of committing any crime of which drunkenness is an element, in addition to other punishment inflicted therefor.

Section 3. Whenever a person has been declared a ^{habitual} common drunkard, the court declaring him as such shall at the same time enter an order prohibiting the sale of intoxicating liquor to him for a period of two years.

1 Section 4. Any person who, within the two-year period
2 referred to in Section 3 of this Act, shall sell or give any
3 intoxicating liquor to any person who ~~had~~ ^{is} been declared to be a
4 ^{habitual} common drunkard as defined in this Act shall be guilty of a
5 misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine of
6 not more than five hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in jail
7 for not more than three months, or by both such fine and
8 imprisonment.

9 Section 5. The term "intoxicating liquor" as used herein
10 shall include whiskey, brandy, rum, gin, wine, ale, porter,
11 beer, and all spirituous, vinous, malt and other fermented or
12 distilled liquors.
