SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 114

IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA

TWENTY-FIRST SESSION

A BILL

For an Act entitled: "An Act imposing additional duties on
United States Commissioners serving as
recorders; providing for payment therefor;
and establishing an effective date."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE TERRITORY OF ALASKA:

Section 1. The purpose of this Act is to enable the
Territorial Department of Mines to accumulate and disseminate
information on the status of mining ground in the performance of
its prescribed duties.

Section 2. The recorder of each recording precinct in
Alaska shall prepare and forward to the Commissioner of Mines on
the first day of each month a copy of each new mining claim
location certificate, and a report of each other instrument
affecting title of existing mining claims, recorded during the
preceding 30-day period.

Section 3. Payment shall be made to the recorder ^{upon}
~~receipt~~ ^{upon vouchers approved} by the Department of Mines of the report of instruments
at the rate of one dollar for each instrument received.

Section 4. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and
this Act shall become effective on April 1, 1953.
